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


## Restorative Justice

After the Easter break, we are going to trial using Restorative Justice across the school to deal with all behaviour incidents. Restorative Justice is based on 4 R's (Respect, Responsibility, Repair and Reintegration). Through using common language with the children, they know what to expect from all adults across the school. The approach is based on gaining positive outcomes from negative behaviour; giving children opportunities to learn from their mistakes. It is also a really good way of supporting children's communication skills.

So that you are aware in advance, this is the script all staff will be using with the children:

### Restorative Justice Script:

1. What happened?
2. What were you thinking?
3. What needs to happen now?
4. What will you do differently next time?

The discussion with children may lead to protective or educational consequences to reinforce learning from the incident.
